This booklet contains a list of scholarships available to Seniors in the Hanford Joint Union High School District. **You may apply for as many scholarships as you qualify for.** Carefully read the criteria for applying for each scholarship. Please make sure you meet the qualifications listed in each scholarship for which you apply and have attached all the required elements. If a scholarship description says you **MUST** be something (member of club, certain ethnicity, etc.), that means exactly what it says – you **MUST BE!** If the description says **“PRIORITY GIVEN TO”**, and you meet the other criteria listed, you can go ahead and apply. Scholarship sponsors do not like to review applications only to find the student wasn’t even eligible to apply!

Remember! You are in competition with other students in your graduating class; in some instances, you are competing with students from HHS, HWHS, SPHS, Hanford Online Charter, and EFJ and other schools in Central California. The committees will decide on the most accurate, complete, sincere, and neatest application. Well-written essays may decide the scholarship recipient. *Your attention to detail will reward you.*

We have made every attempt to ensure the accuracy of information in this booklet. The scholarships and criteria listed are based on donor participation from prior years. Availability and dollar amounts may change, but based on their participation in the past, the information remains the same for the most part. However, even though some scholarships listed have not been confirmed, we encourage you to apply for any that you qualify for.

Disclaimer: Due to CoVid19, some of our Donor Organization may be unable to hold their fundraising activities and therefore may be unable to offer a scholarship, even though they have been published in this and subsequent booklets.



This year we are going with a new online program, “Going Merry” for our Local Scholarship Program. These scholarships are those that you would apply for using our “Standard Applications.” There are about 90 plus scholarships in this category. The online application process in “Going Merry” will also get you ready for applying to many state and national scholarships listed on their online database. Once you have created your account, you can begin uploading your documents and filling out your profile. Your profile is how you will be matched up for all the scholarships that you are eligible for, so be sure to include as much information about yourself and your family as possible.

The HJUHSD Career Centers will be hosting online workshops once the program goes live with the HJUHSD Local Scholarship information.

For those of you interested, Going Merry has an app you can download to your phone. Search for it on your Android or Apple App stores.

2020-21 HJUHSD Scholarship Essay

Your three scholarship essays must be uploaded on Going Merry so that they will be available to you for all the Local Scholarships. You should carefully check your spelling, grammar, and accuracy of information. **Remember!** You are in competition with many others for these scholarships. *The only difference between you and your competitors is YOU!* Some scholarships have separate or additional essay requirements and those will be listed on the individual Scholarship Applications on Going Merry.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the essay is to persuade the scholarship committee that you are a candidate who should be highly considered. When beginning an autobiographical or narrative essay, the first point to keep in mind is that the reader is unfamiliar with you as an individual. Through your writing, the scholarship committee must be able to develop an understanding of your past and present accomplishments. Equally important are your educational and career goals, as well as your family's financial situation.

The following are the prompts that you need to use to write your required essays. Remember that there may be an organization or two that may require an additional essay along with the three required essays.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

In 500 words or less, tell us about you. This can include, but not limited to: Your role in your family, your personality, your hopes, your dreams, or obstacles you have encountered that you have had to overcome. Help us get to know you by sharing some details about your life. Do not limit your story to your school activities and adventures.

COMMUNITY SERVICE/ACTIVITIES

In 250 words or less, describe your community service/school activities. Use this time to describe your thoughts on leadership, service projects, and how they helped mold the person you are today. You can also include information about your clubs and activities that you have participated in during high school.

FINANCIAL NEED

In 500 words or less, tell us about why you need assistance paying for your postsecondary choice of education. Financial need can be a determining factor in some of the scholarships that you are applying to. Not all financial need is caused by low income. Remember, these essays are confidential and are shared only with the scholarship donor committees.

The California Teachers Association (CTA) is proud to sponsor a number of scholarships through their scholarships program. Applicants must be claimed as a dependent on their parents'/guardians' current tax forms and must be the dependent of an active, retired, or deceased CTA member. GPA should reflect high academic achievement. Requires Official Transcript. Applications are available on the CTA website. (Please also download and read the Brochure with additional instructions.). See the CTA website to find the application to all scholarships sponsored by CTA.

Selection Criteria

Scholarships are awarded based on: Applicant's Statement - 50%, School and Community Activities - 20%, 2 Letters of Recommendation - 15% each. Requires official transcript and a 250-word essay describing your personal vision, unique qualities and future goals (Explain any special circumstances related to medical, physical or psychological condition that may have affected your grades).

Description:

The Scholarships for Military Children Program was created to recognize the contributions of military families to the readiness of the fighting force and to celebrate the role of the commissary in the military family community. It is the intent of the program that a scholarship funded through contributions be awarded annually at each commissary operated by the Defense Commissary Agency worldwide.

A total of 500 scholarship grants, each for \$2,000, will be awarded for school year 2021-22. There will be at least one recipient selected at every commissary location where qualified applications are received, and additional recipients will be selected based on a prorated basis, so more applicants will be selected from those commissaries with larger numbers of applicants.

Selection Criteria

Only students who possess a valid (not expired) U.S. Uniformed Services Identification and Privilege Card (DD Form 1173) and whose parent(s) are serving, or have served, in the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force or Coast Guard may apply for a scholarship.

Must be enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time undergraduate program leading to a bachelor's degree or a community/junior college designed to allow for a direct transfer into a four-year program.

High school applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 basis).

Applicants or sponsors do not need to live at an installation with a commissary – simply select the commissary where you shop or the one nearest to you.

We fund a College Scholarship program for children of Active First Responders(EMS, FIRE, POLICE) who each day place their lives on the line for all of US. The foundation assists Emergency Organizations with funds, materials, equipment and/or Volunteers when needed. The America's 911 Foundation 2021 Scholarships will be a \$2,000 award. However, at this time, we are not sure of the number of recipients we will be able to award as COVID canceled our Major Fund Raiser. The Essay question is: "An uplifting essay about a 1st responder you know" (Essay does not have to be about your parent. ie: survival, heroic, beating the odds, triumph over tragedy).

Selection Criteria

What is a First Responder:

Someone who has arrest authority, someone who works on an ambulance or rescue vehicle helping others, EMTs, Paramedics, Firefighters, Police, Sheriff's Office, Game Warden, Border Partol, Park Rangers, Marshals, Correctional Officers or a dispatcher for any of the noted above. These positions can be Paid or Volunteer.

If you or your parent, one or both, is an active duty First Responder you are eligible.

If your parent is retired or disabled you are not eligible.

Federal Employee Education & Assistance Fund Scholarship

Award Amount: \$1,000 to \$5,000

The FEEA Scholarship Program is for current federal civilian or postal employees and their dependent family members. Adult children and other relatives are eligible if claimed on the sponsoring employee's tax return. Active duty military members and their dependents are eligible only through a sponsoring civilian employee spouse. Military retirees and dependents are eligible if the retiree (or retiree's spouse) is a current civilian federal employee. Applicants who are dependents must be full-time students. Selection Criteria

The applicant or the applicant's sponsoring federal employee must have at least three (3) years of federal civilian or postal service as of scholarship application deadline. All applicants must be current high school seniors or college students working toward an accredited degree and enrolled in a two- or four-year undergraduate, graduate or postgraduate program. California Table Grape Field Workers (Two-Year or Vocational) Scholarship

Award Amount: \$3,500

Description:

California table grape growers are offering scholarships to field workers and their children to attend four-year universities or colleges in California. There are two scholarship types available. Up to three \$25,000 four-year scholarships are available. The scholarships are offered to students who will attend California universities or colleges. Up to three \$14,500 scholarships are available.

This scholarship award, called the Bridge Scholarship, is designed to help students bridge the transition from community college to a four-year university.

Selection Criteria

To be eligible the applicant, a parent, or a legal guardian must have been employed as a field worker in a California table grape vineyard during the 2020 harvest season or plan to be so employed during the 2021 season. Applicants must be high school graduates or high school seniors graduating in 2021. Selection is based on clear educational or career goals, obstacles overcome, leadership ability, academic performance, community service, and financial need. Preference will be given to those expressing a commitment to a future in agriculture and/or a career in the California table grape industry.

Applicants must be planning to attend full-time at a community college, trade or vocational program, as well as four-year institutions. Students must attach a copy of their FAFSA, three letters of recommendation, official transcript, and photo. Please feel free to attach additional pages as needed. Parent or guardian must log in to their CSEA website to obtain the application.

Selection Criteria

The CSEA Scholarship Committee ranks applications on the basis of academic achievement, character, leadership and extra curricular activities within the community. Financial need may also be taken into consideration on some. Minimum 3.0 GPA required.

Luso American Education Foundation Youth Scholarships

For their Category C-1 General scholarships (ranging from \$500 to \$1,500) applicants must be of Portuguese descent (must show proof upon request) or be enrolled in high school Portuguese language classes. Minimum 3.0 GPA; provide official transcript, SAT or ACT scores and two letters of recommendation. For the Category A Youth Member scholarships (ranging from \$300 to \$10,000), applicants must be a Luso-American Life Insurance Society member in good standing (the policy must be in the student's name, Not parents or grandparents, etc.). The Italian Catholic Federation is a National Roman Catholic Fraternal Organization composed of persons of Italian ancestry (including their non-Italian spouses) who are of the Roman Catholic Faith.

One of the many programs of the Federation is to offer college scholarships to further the education of students who achieve a total cumulative GPA (3 ½ years) of at least 3.2 and meet all of the requirements in either #1 or #2:

Selection Criteria

The Ray Jones Scholarship Fund, established in 2009 at Central Valley Community Foundation, provides financial assistance to selected California Indian students graduating from high school in the central valley. At least five scholarship awards each in the amount of \$2,500 may be awarded to selected applicants seeking a postsecondary degree at an accredited two or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school, and at least one \$5,000 scholarship may be awarded to a selected applicant seeking a bachelor's degree at a four-year college or university. This scholarship serves California Indian students graduating from high school in Merced, Mariposa, Madera, Fresno, Kings and Tulare counties. Priority in the selection process is given to California Indian students graduating from Sierra High School located in Tollhouse, Fresno County, in memory of Ray Jones, Class of 1965, and in honor of his Mono-Chukchansi heritage.

Selection Criteria

Eligible applicants must: Be of California Indian descent. Be a graduating senior in good standing with a minimum 2.0 G.P.A. Graduate from high school in Merced, Mariposa, Madera, Fresno, Kings or Tulare County. Demonstrate financial need. Seek enrollment in a postsecondary degree program at an accredited two or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school.

The Knights of Columbus is a global Catholic fraternal service order. Membership is composed of practicing Catholic men. The organization was founded in 1882 as a mutual benefit society for working-class and immigrant Catholics in the United States. Applicants of the Knights of Columbus Hanford Council # 2343 must be seeking continuing education either at a college, university or vocational school. Selection Criteria

Candidates will be scored on academic achievements, extra-curricular involvement, community service and how a financial award will help to achieve their educational and career goals.
